



Raveing undertakten, for ye glorie of God, and advancemente of ye Christian faith and honour of our ting & countrie, a voyage to plant ye first colonie in ye Portherne parts of Virginia, doe by these presents solemnly & mutualy in ye presence of God, and one of another, covenant, & combine ourselves togeather into a Civill body politicit; for our better ordering, & preservation & furtherance of ye ends aforesaid; and by vertue hereof to enacte, constitute and frame such just & equal Lawes, ordinances, Acts, constitutions & offices from time to time, as shall be thought most meete & convenient for ye generall good of ye colonie : unto which we promise all due submission and obedience. 




