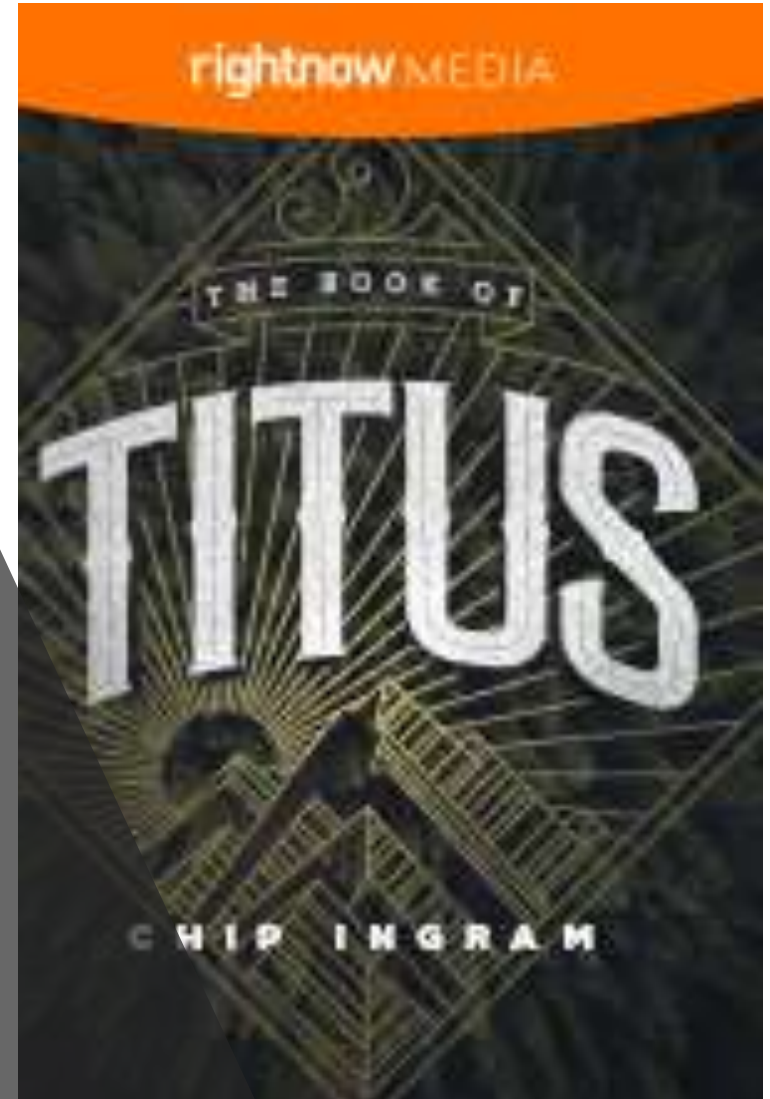


Titus 2: 11-15

# Amazing Grace



# BY GRACE WE HAVE BEEN SAVED FROM THE PENALTY OF SIN (vs 11)

*“For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men . . .”*

*“grace”* – unmerited favor of God

*“appeared”* – epiphany, like the rays of the sun

# BY GRACE WE ARE BEING SAVED FROM THE POWER OF SIN (vs 12)

Saying “no” to the world

“*ungodliness*” – lack of reverence and devotion

“*worldly desires*”-

Saying “yes’ to God

“*sensibly*” – a life under God’s control

“*righteously*” - a life of obedience

“*godly*” - a life closely related to God

# BY GRACE WE ARE BEING SAVED FROM THE POWER OF SIN (cont.)

- Grace provides a new nature
- Grace provides a new teacher (Holy Spirit)
- Grace provides a new subject (Word of God)

# BY GRACE WE WILL BE SAVED FROM THE PRESENCE OF SIN (vs 13)

*“looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus.”*

*“looking”* – to long for with great anticipation

# BY GRACE WE HAVE BEEN REDEEMED FROM THE SLAVERY OF SIN (vs 14 - 15)

*“redeem”* – to buy from the slave market

Paul’s commands to Titus:

*“speak”* – proclaim grace and a grateful life

*“exhort”* – plead to respond to grace with  
devotion

*“reprove”* – confront false teachers
