# The Body of Christ 1 Cor. 12:12-27

### The Miracle of Unity

"For even as the body is one and yet has many members, and all the members of the body, though they are many, are one body, so also is Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews of Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. For the body is not one member but many."

### The Necessity of Participation

"For the body is not one member but many." If the foot says, 'Because I am not an eye, I am not part of the body,' it is not for this reason any the less a part of the body. And if the ear says, 'Because I am not an eye, I am not a part of the body,' it is not for this reason any the less a part of the body..."

## The Necessity of Participation (cont.)

"If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But now God has placed the members, each one of them, in the body, just as He desired. If they were all one member, where would the body be?"

## The Honor of Humility

"But now there are many members, but one body. And the eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you"; or again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you." On the contrary, it is much truer that the parts of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary . . ."

### The Honor of Humility (cont.)

"... and those members of the body which we deem less honorable, on these we bestow more abundant honor and our less presentable members become much more presentable, whereas our more presentable members have no need of it. But God has so composed the body, giving more abundant honor to that member which lacked"

## The Blessing of Mutual Care

". . . so that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it. Now you are Christ's body and individually members of it."
